

It's been a massive year at Waikaka School. The drive for the Board during this year was to take the school from "Good to Great". We employed Nicky Millar as Principal to help us with this mission. And we are delighted with the result.

We have seen the completion of the new school pool enclosure (and just this week, new toilet structure (and just this week), replacement of our verandah roof and modernisation of the classrooms with new cabinets and the big sliding door between the middle and senior classes. 




